A Note from the Director...

I grew up in a family with four boys. My brothers and I took James Bond movies seriously -- so seriously, in fact, that my twin brother actually broke up with a high school girlfriend because she complained to him that *Octopussy* was "unrealistic." Twenty-some years later, I think even my brother would have to give in and say: Becky, you were right all along. Real-life British spies did not spend their time blowing up strategic centers of world domination (whether hidden under mountains, in the Arctic, or in outer space), nor did they fight villains who were armed with deadly steel teeth or lethal flying bowler hats. And nobody in the real world looked as good as these movie agents and their transient love interests did, whether in bikinis (my brothers' favorite scenes) or boxers (my favorite scenes.)*

In many ways, James Bond represents the antithesis of many values held by the Quire and other LGBT groups. The movies are often misogynistic, chauvinistic, gratuitously violent, and occasionally homophobic. But the music used in those movies was sung by artists dear to the LGBT community -- among them great singers like Shirley Bassey, Sheena Easton, Rita Coolidge, Tina Turner, Carly Simon, Roberta Flack, Dionne Warwick, Madonna, Paul McCartney, and Duran Duran -- and the campiness of many of the lyrics (and character names!) makes them fair game.

So I wish you all an enjoyable evening in honor of James Bond, John Steed, Emma Peel, Dick Tracy, and all their ilk. Just to shake things up a bit we've also thrown in a couple selections -- "I Found Love" and Dolly Parton's "Romeo" -- which are not about intrigue and back-stabbing, just straightforward mutual attraction.
