A NOTE FROM THE BOARD CHAIR

Dear friends, family, and fans,

To address the obvious first – what a year it has been. After the highly successful return of *The Man Behind the Dream* in early 2020 to audiences in both Iowa City and Cedar Rapids, the Board of Directors made the necessary decision to cancel the remainder of the 2019-2020 Season in response to the COVID-19 epidemic. Over the next 18+ months, the Board worked to sustain The Quire's financial foundation, provide spaces of connection and community for Members, and even tried to work on unique solutions to creating music without being together in person to perform.

With that goal in mind, **Colleen McRoberts** – with seemingly boundless determination – directed the *Virtual Quire Project*, gathering Members (and a few community members) together to rehearse, record, and virtually perform one of the pieces of The Quire's 25th Anniversary commissioned work. As Members have returned to rehearsal for our 2021-2022 Season, many adjustments have been needed, including rehearsing with masks while distanced from each other in Zion Lutheran's worship hall, managing lower vocal stamina after months of less singing, and doing all of that under the direction of our newly hired Artistic & Choral Director, Alex Heetland. As The Quire welcome his ideas and energy, we also continue to work towards the long-term goals we had been working towards prior to the pandemic, such as a review of operations to ensure a healthy and sustainable leadership structure, implementation of new software to help The Quire acknowledge and celebrate donors more consistently, and continuing to grow our financial foundation to support the long-term needs of the organization.

As The Quire returns to the stage for this concert, however, I am reminded of the dedication and labor which it took to sustain The Quire for its first 25 years – along with the generous support from so many of you who continue to sit in our audience today. We continue to be able to build this community and gather in song because of the belief we all – friends, family, fans, Members, leadership, volunteers, and staff – have in the power of sharing the experience of music together. For your part in keeping that experience alive, I thank you, and I hope you enjoy the show!

A NOTE FROM THE DIRECTOR

Welcome to The Quire's first in-person concert in two years! This is also my first concert with The Quire, and it brings me great joy to finally share the hard work we have done over the past few months. Singing in a choir right now looks and sounds different. Singing in masks and being distanced during rehearsal means that it is harder to hear your neighbor and make music as a choir. Despite these difficulties, this group loves singing together and brings so much energy and care when they do. I am sure you will hear the love and energy tonight.

Pride and Joy is a two-part affair. First, you will hear a set we sang for Iowa City Pride in October. This set reminds us that our own pride continues in a long line of LGBTQ+ activists that came before us. We have our rights because people fought for them, so it is important that we continue the mission. During "Days of Pride and Days of Hope", we will share the names of people that inspire us in Pride. I hope you will also share a name at that time. After that, we are excited to premiere a new set of pieces by Connor Warren Smith. The Quire commissioned Songs of our Pride for our 25th anniversary season and intended to premiere them at the Spring 2020 concert. This plan - like so many others - was disrupted, so we are overjoyed to finally share these pieces. Songs of our Pride gives us four aspects of Pride in four contrasting musical vignettes. We start with a call to join the song of Pride, followed by two intimate stories of relationship. The set ends with an anthem of personal acceptance leading to community, saying, "this is where change starts." I hope these new works inspire you the way they have us.

The Joy part of tonight's concert features some Winter-time favorites, including songs that celebrate Christmas and Solstice time. This time of year brings joy for many people. As we close the evening, though, we remember that the holidays are not joyful for everyone. Sometimes being home for Christmas is only in our dreams, but we find community or build our own families where we are. Too many people in the LGBTQ+ world know this from experience. And as a little celebration of our chosen families, we will finish with the party piece, "La Vie Boheme", from RENT. Please enjoy this evening with its variety of musical styles and stories.
