

- Provide resources and community support for LGBTQ older adults and transgender lowans.





A NOTE FROM THE DIRECTOR

This year has been a bit of a wild ride for the Quire. In December, we were excited to give our first concert since 2020. After that concert we were looking forward to starting up again strong in January for our spring season. With the surge of COVID-19 cases due to Omicron throughout January, we decided it would be best to wait for things to settle down a bit before getting back together. So, after a slightly truncated rehearsal time, we are proud to share with you our spring 2022 concert, *Singing for Our Lives*.

The first set reminds us of the importance LGBTQ choruses have had in bringing attention to the fight for LGBTQ rights. There is a little history lesson in it. Two songs (*Singing for our Lives* and *Thou, Lord, Our Refuge*) were important in the wake of Harvey Milk's assassination. With One Voice is a reflection on how all of us – queer and ally – can speak out against policies that that discriminate against LGBTQ people. It was written to honor Steven Cozza, who led the charge to lift the ban on gay leadership in the Boy Scouts of America. Queer choirs have long given voice to those of us who didn't have one because we weren't suitable for conversation and helped us celebrate ourselves.

When I was interviewing with the Quire last summer, I told them that I wish younger Alex would have known a group like this existed. Small town Iowa wasn't a place where I saw queerness celebrated or even talked about. Some things have changed since I was growing up, and I don't claim my story to be universal, but somehow we keep having to fight the same fights. That is what this second set is about. When people are intent on taking books off library shelves because they have a queer character in them, remember that *Reading* and seeing ourselves in what we read is important. Sharing our stories is how we learn to see each other as humans. Our *Testimony* is important to help other people know that you will not *Disappear*, and *You Will Be Found*. Singing is one way the Quire stands up and says, *Here's Where I Stand*. I hope you will join us by telling your story and letting people know where you stand, too. All of us – Gay and Straight together, Trans, Bi, and Queer together, are *Singing for Our Lives*.




